Rosemary and Robert Forrester Tales of world travel and a Jack Russell named Tara...

Rotary Club Umhlanga hosted husband and wife team, Rosemary and Robert Forrester, who kept the audience captivated with tales of their journey around the world by boat. From their roots from what was then Rhodesia, the couple worked in South America before going to Gibraltar to take delivery of the yacht "Deusa". Whilst in Columbia, Robert flew to Florida to get essential boat parts, he returned with a six week old Jack Russell puppy, Tara. This tiny dog, learns to adapt to life on board through storms, calm waters, marauding seagulls and nosey customs officials. Twice she is washed overboard and the second time is found four days later. Rosemary recounted their incredible adventures as they sailed from the Panama Canal to Australia, and on to Malaysia and Thailand, where they survived the Boxing Day Tsunami. Their journey took them through the Indian Ocean, past the Seychelles, on to Mozambique, where they came ashore
