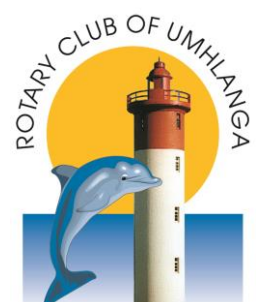
World Diabetes Day 2018, La Lucia Mall

OYSTER BOX PROJECT JOINS WITH ROTARY CLUB OF DURBAN NORTH TO REACH RURAL COMMUNITIES



Donated items of linen and towels have filtered down to Rotary Club of Durban North and the Satellite Club of Kwa Sani. Rotarian Anthony Connolly has reported back that after meeting with Pierre Horn, Director of Family Literacy, needs were identified in their rural community. All the items received from The Oyster Box, as well as three cases of Tommy Takkies, RC of Durban North's local clothes collection, three large cases of books and stationary, and sixty Goodie Bags from the Amashova Cycle Race, were donated to Family Literacy. The project has a system of adult team leaders that look after youngsters, having to read a set number of books, the children in the teams have to in turn also read a set number of books. When all achieve or exceed the targets, incentives are provided by the project directors. Pierre has nine different camps where the donated items will be distributed, with the goodie bags broken down for a more far reaching impact on these communities. The donation has also come just in time for the end of year motivational awards; this will add impact to the incentives and make the project sustainable to continue to promote reading and literacy. Rotary Club of Umhlanga is proud to be associated with the project and wishes the directors continued growth and success for the future.
